Outreach @ WAS-H



Darlene Dittoe conducts Outreach Workshops

If you've never experienced the joy of leading an outreach session for WAS-H, you should talk to Darlene Dittoe, an active WAS-H member who also serves on our Board of Directors. When Darlene isn't finding handymen to do repairs to WAS-H's building, she donates her time by hosting watercolor workshops and spending quality time with her children and grandchildren.

In 2021, Darlene began facilitating classes at the West University Senior Center. Darlene put together a two-day workshop for the group and since she began, she has taught several sessions at the Center. Due to space constraints at the Senior Center, the workshop is limited to 12 participants. Darlene's workshops are so popular, there is always a waitlist!

Most of the participants have little or no experience with watercolor, so Darlene starts with the basics. On the first day, students learn how to handle the medium and the importance of becoming skilled at determining the ratio of water to pigment. On the second day, students are provided a choice of different images to paint. She provides lightboxes so they can outline the image and begin their own painting. The second day is the most fun, since participants leave the session with new skills, pride and enthusiasm for watercolor!

WAS-H provides basic art supplies for these outreach programs. Our outreach program provides paint, watercolor paper, brushes for students to use, free of charge.

WAS-H receives requests from groups around Houston for a class or workshops from one of our WAS-H members each week. Unfortunately, we don't have a list of instructors who are willing to facilitate these classes, so we are not able to meet the demand.


