Second Place Mohammad Ali Bhatti "Blue Sonata"




Third Place Eleanor Buchan "Backstage"

Judge: "The background was so perfect, it didn't look painted. I like that it was different and stood out among the others.


Artist: This is a painting of me and my father when I played a part in the "Wizard of Oz". My father was part of the backstage crew.

Judge: "This is Just a wonderful painting and beautifully done. So many things to look at."


Artist: I was in Cologne Germany towards the end of the day when I looked up and saw the Sentinels. The color just exploded as the sun was setting.






