September Gallery Exhibit

In September, the days begin to grow shorter and Houston welcomes the first signs of a changing season. At the WAS-H gallery on one of those early fall afternoons, we welcomed Woodlands artist, Susan Hotard, to judge our show "September Song: Reflections of Change In Our life and Environs". Susan is a signature member of many national oil and acrylic painting organizations and recently won the Top Fifty Award in the Portrait Society of America's International Competition. When judging, Susan said she relies first on her gut reaction to the paintings. She then analyzes those she's attracted to in order to determine the classic artistic elements of the painting that caused that attraction.

In the case of her first place selection, Mohammed Ali Bhatti's "White Rose", Susan was attracted to the complex composition created as the strong light patterns traveled through the painting, from the darkest black and the subtle whites of the fragile rose. Mohammed said he was trying to paint the many shades of white of the flower and contrast it to the luminescent black that he achieved by painting many layers. Interesting note: When Mohammed was a new member, he won the very

first WAS-H exhibit he entered.

For second place, Susan selected another repeat winner, Ruby Allen, and her painting "It's Autumn Again". Susan said that the strong atmospheric effect and the wonderful composition indicated an artist of great skill. Ruby says that she draws inspiration from photos and mental images of her many travels, but that she lets her mind compose the images she paints.

Susan was next moved to select Larry Spitzberg's painting "Generations Pass Each Other By" for the third place award because of his loose, impressionistic style and vibrant colors.

Inspiration came to Larry when he was in Honfleur, France and saw a boat full of tourists pass a young couple pushing a baby in a stroller in the other direction on shore. He said that his dislike of drawing leads to his impressionistic approach.

Congratulations to all our award winners and thanks to all of our September artists and volunteers for making this such an enjoyable show!

Winner's Words

Congratulations to Mohammad Ali Bhatti on his Blue Ribbon win in September 2019 show! Here is what he wrote:

"It is indeed an honor and privilege for me to be one of the participants in the monthly exhibitions at Watercolor Art Society Houston. For the last four years, I have been enjoying participating in all art exhibitions organized by WAS-H and of teaching art and sharing my experiences, expertise, skills and techniques of watercolor painting with the amazing community of Houston. During my teaching sessions at WAS-H, such as portrait painting, portrait drawing, landscape painting and flower painting, I encourage our members to develop their painting techniques and skills. I frequently conduct demos in my classes and during the class sessions I do warm up studies.

The first prize winner painting for the month of September 2019 was one of my flower painting class demos and it was never intended to be entered in any of the monthly shows. The interesting story is that I wasn't sure about the theme for September show, so I brought about 6 paintings on different themes. However, on my arrival at the gallery, I came to know that there is a rather broad theme this month, so I randomly picked up two small watercolor paintings that I did in one of my flower painting classes. I chose these two paintings for their dramatic composition, bold and loose brush work, color tones and for subtle values ranging from light to dark.

I am so happy that Judge Susan Hotard, who herself happen to be an outstanding portrait painter, spoke very highly about my painting and gave me extraordinary comments and discussed with the audience the artistic qualities, dramatic composition, colors and the value variation in my winning painting."

September Demo Report



WAS-H Signature member Peihong Endris delighted us at the September meeting with a wonderful demo of painting peonies with butterflies. Peihong gave us an introduction to her materials and discussed rice paper, Chinese brushes, watercolor paint and ink. She explained that the focus of an artist is the idea and that the artist sees, feels, and then paints. Peihong painted a beautiful painting of peonies and butterflies. Watching her paint was enchanting.

Peihong is from China where she graduated from the Central Academy of Fine Arts and worked as an art editor for the Beijing Review. She has taught classes at WAS-H and numerous other locations. She has had her work exhibited in Houston, Dallas, Beijing, Tokyo and more.

Peihong is teaching two workshops this fall. In October she will teach Chinese Brush Painting: Gong-bi. The class is four Tuesday mornings October 8th through October 29th.

And in November she will teach a weekend class, Chinese Brush Painting: Composition Methods that will meet November 22 through November 24.

We are now accepting submissions for our 43rd International Watermedia Exhibition!

Which of your works will you enter?

The Watercolor Art Society-Houston opened the entry for submissions to the 43rd Annual International Watermedia Exhibition on Wednesday, September 11, 2019. More than \$7000 in prizes and awards will be granted to the winners. Most importantly, those selected for the month long exhibition will have their works on display for sale in the fourth largest market in the United States.

Artists throughout the country and in many foreign countries are sifting through their portfolios or creating new works to enter into the competition. Please don't hesitate too long, however, as the entry deadline is now December 30, 2019 at 11:59 Mountain Standard Time.

This and other changes have been made for the 43rd IWE to broaden the scope and explain the workings of the exhibition for those new to this level of competition. As in the past, every artist should carefully read and understand the 43rd IWE prospectus before sending in their work. Also artists can simply go to the WAS-H International Water-media Exhibition website and click on the links to the CaFE system and as well as the 43rd Prospectus at: https://watercolorhouston.org/International-Exhibition.

The most significant change, however, is the announcement of a new IWE juror, Mr. Eric Wiegardt, AWS-DF, NWS. Mr. Wiegardt has been awarded watercolor painting's highest honor: the Gold Medal and Dolphin Fellow from the American Watercolor Society, New York. He is nationally and internationally known as an artist and teacher. He has left an indelible mark on the watercolor art scene with his bold, loose painting style. He has participated in numerous museum exhibitions throughout the US and overseas.

The IWE Exhibition will open Sunday, March 8, 2020 and run through Thursday, April 2, 2020. A reception and awards cere-mony will initiate the exhibition at 3:30 pm during which winners will be announced and awards presented.

Art on "The Go"

POWER OF WORDS by Shirl Riccetti, WAS-H member Artwork by Cori Austin



Even though I have read a few of Frances Mayes' books, beginning with the "Under the Tuscan Sun", her recent book "See You in the Piazza", is a joyous read. Spurred by curiosity, she revels in all of her finds. Her writing presents detailed visits to many almost hidden Italian villages. She finds unknown centuries-old places. Surprisingly, she and her husband head for the local tourist office, doing research and meeting people. Most villages seem to have three major items: first, a Church, with over abundance of craftsmanship, and dramatic paintings. Francis Mayes, in her search, delves into the background of these many painters. Her words describe their colors and compositions.

Second, most villages have some sort of a museum. They are not necessarily large, but interesting. One village had a collection of artifacts in a villa once occupied by two brothers. The artifacts were found on their properties, some possibly Etruscan. Each museum has a keeper, who watches and cares for the

property, often sitting outside the door, with a big key.

Third, in each village is a restaurant, or many trattoria. Her book details her delicious meals, and wine pairings. Frances Mayes writes in a notebook, sometimes back at her hotel. But, she also commented that between she and her husband, they carry a lot of electronic devices. I am assuming computers and his photography equipment.

Cori Austin draws, paints, writes... in any order. And she journals. "I sketch with a Micron or a Winsor Newton Microliner on a watercolor journal. I have to fight to not try to get every detail, as that's what my hands want to do. If I am only (only?) trying to capture the day's events and the joy of it, I have a favorite signo pen that flows smoothly, so I can write fast. I love to glue in all the brochures, ticket stubs, etc. and write my memories and impressions and my own personal journey. I would call this my travel journal. I find that I'm compelled to try to remember and capture as many details as I can from the trip."

Cori relates a story that while happily sitting on a bench in Monet's garden in Giverny, France, painting shapes and colors, she heard a voice, "Madame, it is forbidden to paint in Monet's garden." She documented this moment. She continues: "I also do visual journaling, but I don't do this while traveling. It is more of an art/intuitive process, combining collage, paint, mark-making, stencils with journaling. I call these my visual journals or art journals." She has a group that meets monthly, her "favorite day of the month".

Robert Straight comments that, when he travels, he "writes with doodles, and turns them into etchings." Of the many classes that he has taken, he mentioned that some classes demand "journaling". Again, its the words that sometimes bind our experiences. His advice is: "It's important to

make your descriptions visual."

Personally, I have my spiral bound sketchbook, in which I draw and write around the sketches. And I carry another small notebook, tucked in my pack. Day one, I am full of words. By day 5, I may do a paragraph. The following week, a word or two appears on each page. After that, Where is that notebook? Truth.

Artists, pick up that pen, fill it with words. It will be an excellent supporting cast member to your work. It's a tool to help you remember, and carry you back to that original artistic moment that captured you. Carpe Diem!

· Collage

Allowed as long as water media is the dominant element, No restrictions on collage source (i.e. Fabric allowed, commercial papers, photos, etc.).

· Enhancement Media

Less than 20% watercolor pencils, pastels, wax accents/resists, charcoal, graphite, metallic water based paint, water based iridescent paints.
